### EXPLANATORY NOTES

to the

### ANNUAL ACCOUNTS 2022

#### General

The Dutch-Russian Law Association (DRLA) is an association with full legal capacity that has been established under the laws of the Netherlands on October 23, 2018. It has its statutory seat in the municipality of The Hague and its registered office at (2313 GZ) Leiden, Du Rieustraat 1. The DRLA is registered with the Dutch Chamber of Commerce under number 72911794.

The DRLA is a non-governmental organization. Its membership consists of law students, lawyers and other legal professionals residing in the Netherlands and the Russian Federation.

The DRLA aims to represent the views of its members and promote a fair administration of justice, the rule of law and the observance of fundamental rights in the Netherlands and the Russian Federation by organizing seminars, teaching practices, trainings, traineeships and meetings as well as through publications. #### Financial year 2022

The financial year 2022 coincided with the calendar year 2022 and ran from 1 January 2022 through 31 December 2022.

#### Balance sheet 2022

- The DRLA does not (yet) own any fixed assets.
- The DRLA does not run a business and, therefore, holds no inventories and has no receivables to claim.

- As an association without business operations, the DRLA is not under a statutory obligation to make provisions in its annual accounts; nor does the executive board expect any future events that require the creation of (voluntary) provisions.
- The DRLA has been able to finance its activities with allowances, donations and fees levied from its members ever since its inception. In that light, it has not been necessary for the DRLA to incur any current and/or long-term liabilities.

### Statement of income and expenses 2022

- The income of the DRLA in 2022 mainly consisted of levied membership fees. The Executive Board decided to maintain the reduced membership fees that it already established in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic. In total, 20 persons have paid their membership fees for 2022 (EUR 1,000 in total); three persons have been so generous to make a donation, in addition to the regular membership fees paid (EUR 250 in total).
- The expenses of the DRLA in 2022 consisted of the following:
  - Website costs for hosting services and use of the domain name thedrla.org (EUR 150.72).
  - Office costs for a Zoom subscription on behalf of the association in order to be able to host online events (EUR 169.28).
  - Bank charges for the business account of the DRLA held with ING Bank (EUR 171.82).
  - Other costs consisting of:
    - (i) reimbursement of parking costs incurred by the treasurer of the Executive Board in light of his attendance at the Annual Conference 2022 of the Russia & Eastern Europe Knowledge Alliance (REKA) in the Hague (of which the DRLA is an affiliated institution) (EUR 24.00);
    - (ii) costs for the DRLA Drinks event hosted by the DRLA on 29 September 2022 (EUR 89.35); and
    - (iii) costs for presents for the speakers during the lecture on the MH17 judgment of the District Court of the Hague hosted by the DRLA on 24 November 2022 (EUR 36.40) and for drinks afterwards (EUR 33.60).


