to the

### ANNUAL ACCOUNTS 2023

#### General

The Dutch-Russian Law Association (DRLA) is an association with full legal capacity that has been established under the laws of the Netherlands on October 23, 2018. It has its statutory seat in the municipality of The Hague and its registered office at (2313 GZ) Leiden, Du Rieustraat 1. The DRLA is registered with the Dutch Chamber of Commerce under number 72911794.

The DRLA is a non-governmental organization. Its membership consists of law students, lawyers and other legal professionals residing in the Netherlands and the Russian Federation.

The DRLA aims to represent the views of its members and promote a fair administration of justice, the rule of law and the observance of fundamental rights in the Netherlands and the Russian Federation by organizing seminars, teaching practices, trainings, traineeships and meetings as well as through publications. #### Financial year 2023

The financial year 2023 coincided with the calendar year 2023 and ran from 1 January 2023 through 31 December 2023.


#### Balance sheet 2023

- The DRLA does not (yet) own any fixed assets.


- The DRLA does not run a business and, therefore, holds no inventories and has no receivables to claim.
- As an association without business operations, the DRLA is not under a statutory obligation to make provisions in its annual accounts; nor does the executive board expect any future events that require the creation of (voluntary) provisions.
- The DRLA has been able to finance its activities with allowances, donations and fees levied from its members ever since its inception. In that light, it has not been necessary for the DRLA to incur any current and/or long-term liabilities.

#### Statement of income and expenses 2023

- The income of the DRLA in 2023 mainly consisted of membership fees paid. The Executive Board decided to maintain the standard amount of the membership fees at the same level as last year. In total, eight persons have paid their membership fees for 2023 (EUR 375 in total), two of whom have been so generous as to make a donation, in addition to the regular membership fee they paid (EUR 250 in total). An overall payment of EUR 500 from one of these persons was actually only received in March 2024 under the description “DRLA membership fee 2023, 2024”. Half of that amount has been allocated to the financial year 2023 and the other half will be allocated to the financial year 2024, each respectively in the form of a payment of a regular membership fee (EUR 50) and a donation (EU 200).
- The expenses of the DRLA in 2023 consisted of the following:
  - Website costs for hosting services and use of the domain name thedrla.org (EUR 152.17).
  - Office costs for a Zoom subscription on behalf of the association in order to be able to host online events (EUR 169.28).
  - Bank charges for the business account of the DRLA held with ING Bank (EUR 231.35).
  - Other costs consisting of:
    - (i) a get well soon gift for one of the members of the DRLA (EUR 36.50); and
    - (ii) drinks organized after a Q&A session with Mr. A.B. Gutnikov, member of the Advisory Council of the DRLA, on 13 October 2023 (EUR 145.85).
- This has caused an aggregate negative result of EUR 73,65 over the financial year 2023, which has been charged to the association’s equity.


